This is the upper limit of the PBL area and will hopefully result in a group or groups interested to help with weeds along this walk. The project is seeking significant funding from WDC to implement the vision of a native lined walkway along this scenic stretch of river.

Ten new resetting kill traps have been ordered by the animal team. This basic DOC 200 with reset mechanism will run for a year on batteries and will self - reset each time they kill. This removes the need for lines to be walked regularly. They can be used to target possums, rats, mice or mustilids.
